

Health and Safety Policy

It is Horbury's policy to do all that is practicable to ensure a safe and healthy environment for all who work for us or who may be affected by our work and in so doing comply with all relevant legislation and approved codes of practice.

This policy is in accordance with the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974. Horbury's motivation for this commitment is the recognition that our workers are our most important resource.

We intend to ensure the highest standards of Health and Safety are inherent in our procurement and use of equipment, materials and services relating to all our activities.

We consider matters of Health and Safety to be of greater importance than financial concerns including productivity. We also recognise that injuries and ill health suffered through work can be prevented through effective management control and action and are committed to doing everything that is reasonably possible to ensure that these are prevented.

Implementation of this policy is achieved by compliance with the Horbury Safety Management System which incorporates legal requirements; provision of sound advice; effective supervision; training programmes; adequate joint consultation and access to support. The Horbury Safety Management System has been independently certified to have met the requirements of BS OHSAS 18001:2007.

We provide suitable and sufficient information, instruction and training to our workers to enable them to discharge their duties under this policy.

We consult directly with workers on Health and Safety matters by means of safety tours and short duration training.

Horbury requires the co-operation of all its workers to ensure the success of this policy, to achieve continuous improvement in Health and Safety standards and to create a positive Health and Safety culture within all the Company.
